FROM THE SENIOR MINISTER

Dear St Andrew's,

Just a quick note on a theme simultaneously personal and universal, small but eternally significant.

I am writing this on what would have been the 91st birthday of a dear friend of St Andrew's, Marie Rose Graber, who passed away four vears ago. Before joining our church in 2003. Marie had lived an *interesting* life. As a teenager she had been in church when Dietrich Bonheoffer's famous prison letters were being passed around. Yet, she lived the next 60 years as a profound sceptic of religion after reading all of the French and German philosophers during her studies at the University of Paris. As an existential atheist she embraced the Parisian bohemian life of the 1950s and 60s, the circumstances of which she only described euphemistically. She moved to Australia where she taught for two decades at the University of Sydney, maintaining her ponderous approach to all subjects but never quite able to shake a 'sense' of the divine. One day, a member of our church who knew Marie from an evening class lent her a Christian book and invited her to church. After decades of intellectual resistance to the Faith, she surprisingly agreed. And so began the countless hours Buff and I (and many others at St Andrew's) enjoyed in conversation with this remarkable lady, who ultimately came to a deep trust in the grace of Jesus Christ whom she met by an intense study of the Gospels. She once wrote to me:

"I find it incredible that, walking on the dusty roads of Palestine under the hot sun with a bunch of uneducated people, should give me such pleasure and make me look at life so differently, as I listen to the voice of the Teacher. In my life I have read avidly all sorts of books, and I never thought that the Gospels could stimulate thus my brain and give me at the same time the feeling that I had arrived to the most important discovery, to the only worthwhile discovery of my life."

Today, Buff and I will visit Marie's grave. It is bittersweet. But, mostly, we praise God that in His infinite goodness *a humble invitation*—to read a book, to come to church—was the miraculous doorway to Marie's eternal discovery.

Please, friends, never underestimate the small things you do to promote the Lord, in your own way, in your own circumstances!

Congo

Pray for Bishop Masimango Katanda in the Anglican Diocese of Kindu in the Democratic Republic of the Congo. Pray for him in his various responsibilities in the Diocese and beyond. Pray for wisdom and energy as he seeks to teach and encourage those around him.

Praise God for the good rice harvest this year in the whole Province of Maniema which is the Province state where Kindu Diocese is located. Families in the villages can sell the rice but at a low price because of abundance in the market.

Pray for the ongoing training of new Deacons to be ordained on the 29th May, the anniversary of the day of the Ugandan Evangelist Appolo established the Anglican Church in DRCongo. There will be a 3 day retreat for the candidates leading up to the ordination day.
