# FROM THE SENIOR MINISTER

### REV JOHN DICKSON

#### Senior Minister

Dear St Andrew's.

Before I get to the substance of this News Note, let me urge you to invite friends and family to next Sunday's service (17 July at 10am, 5pm, or 7pm) to hear Scottish preacher and public advocate for the Christian faith, David Robertson. He will offer a 35min sermon, *Why Christianity Makes Sense*, then he and I together will field questions. It's a great chance for our loved ones to glimpse the truth and beauty of Christ. Hopefully, *every* week at St Andrew's provides such opportunities, but this coming week will be special.

Changing topics, I want to give some broad answers to a few excellent questions that have been put to me (by several) about the 2020Vision Project. I'm loving the engagement, by the way (especially the pledges that continue to come into the office). Firstly, some have asked: What happens if, after all the pledges have come in, we fall short and don't have enough commitment to go ahead with the project as planned? The answer is simple: although monies already given to the building fund obviously cannot be

returned, any unfulfilled part of your pledge can be revised or retracted without embarrassment. (That said, whatever happens, it is clear that significant money has to be spent on our current property). The crucial importance of pledges right now is to give the Parish Council the confidence that there is sufficient material commitment in the church for the proposed project to go forward. That's the venture to which I intend to give my all.

Secondly, some have asked what exactly is the 'magic number' in pledges—the tipping point for us to press GO. The Parish Council will make a recommendation on this in the next few weeks, but there are too many variables in play for me to be able to give you a clear answer at this point. For example, in the coming weeks we may receive a high amount in actual donations but an insufficient amount in 5-year pledges. On the other hand, we may receive a lower amount in donations but a sufficient amount in 5-year pledges. The other variable is the possibility that certain individuals may be willing to offer the church sizeable no-interest loans. That would change any cash-pledge-borrowing formula we are currently contemplating. One thing on which we are all agreed is that we don't want the church to go into significant bank debt for any extended period. In short, there are too many

'levers' in play right now to declare what the GO number should be! All I know is that your generous pledges are the key.

Finally, people have asked if there is a property Plan B, in case we don't gain sufficient support for the proposed project. You may remember that at the early stages of planning we also looked into the alternative of merely replacing our community hall, constructing it on the same level as the existing church, and building some (required) underground parking. The estimated cost was extraordinary. We would spend almost half of the currently proposed amount for only a quarter of the facilities. Plan C would be a simple refurbishment and update of the property. That would still requires your generosity, but it is the easy option. Plan C, however, and maybe Plan B, would require us to revisit our 2020Vision itself. Instead of hoping to become a *centre of community for* Roseville and beyond, we would need to get comfortable with aiming only at becoming a better version of a local village church. That would still be a noble thing to do, but it would significantly change our plans and our prayers.

Thank you to all those who have raised these questions. I hope these responses clarify.

Parish Council will review our situation at a meeting of Monday 18 July. A clear update will be given at all services on Sunday 24 July. And a parish-wide meeting will be called for late-August, at which the Parish Council will make a recommendation back to the Parish for their consideration.

All of this is in the Lord's hands. And all of you will get a say in the next steps. I am feeling very relaxed—and more than a little excited!

The parishioners of the 1930s and 1950s provided the facilities that generations of St Andrew's folk have been able to utilise for ministry. It is now our opportunity to provide new and updated facilities, not just for our generation, but for the generations of St Andrew's parishioners to come. It is our gift to them. We are keen to provide this support for future generations, but we do not want to saddle them with a debt that may curtail future ministry. This is our chance to establish a base for broad community ministry for Roseville and beyond. Please be praying.
