FROM THE ACTING RECTOR

O Acting Rector

I had something else on, sorry. How was 'family' on Sunday? Was it good enough?

The New Testament uses a number of images to describe the communal life of the Christian community. We are a body— the body of Christ (1 Corinthians 12:12-27). We are a family— brothers and sisters to Jesus and one another (Matthew 12:49-50). We are God's temple, each being 'living stones', and together we are the dwelling place of the Holy Spirit (1 Peter 2:5-7; 1 Corinthians 3:16-17). Jesus prayed that we would be one, just as the Father, Son and Holy Spirit are one (John 17:21).

Each of these images of 'church' emphasises a mutual belonging. The hand cannot say to the foot, "I don't need you". A family is incomplete when one of its members is missing. The structure is weakened when one of its stones is taken away. And so, as members of St Andrew's Church at Roseville we conclude that we *need* each other. When one of us is absent, we are *all* somehow diminished.

We might think of this interdependence from a functional perspective: things go better when everyone turns up and does their job. The few are not disproportionately propping up the many. But the New Testament does not see it this way. Rather, we need each other because we are 'one': a unit, a body, a family. We do not *attend* church. We *are* the church.

Francis Chan tells the story of a member of his church who joined after leaving his life in an American urban gang. To leave a gang while in prison could be suicidal: the repercussions might include rejection, torture, or even death. But this man found that breaking the bonds of relationship was the most difficult part. The gang was his family. They were loyal and dear friends who looked out for him twenty-four hours a day. There was a love and camaraderie he had enjoyed since childhood. They did life together- never mind the little details of drugs, violence and theft- they did it together. The sad realisation that this man came to is that gangs know how to be church better than the church.

Could you ever imagine gang life being reduced to a weekly one-hour gathering? No group would meet briefly once a week and call that a gang. Imagine one gang member walking up to another and saying, "Yo, how was gang? I had to miss this week because life has been crazy!"

We all know enough about gangs to know that's ridiculous. Yet every week we hear Christians asking each other, "How was church?" Something that God designed as a family, a body, a temple home, has been reduced to an optional weekly meeting.

Any gang member will tell you that his gangbuddies have his back. They're there for him. They're loyal, committed, present. And so, when each one of us makes the decision to turn up— whether to church on Sunday, to Small Group, to a Prayer Meeting, to serve at a ministry, or just to care for a sister or brother in need— each of these decisions matters.

There are many good reasons that any single one of us may not be able to be present when we meet. There are many things beyond our control— but quite a few that are within our control. My aim in writing this somewhat awkward missive (and I'm a bit nervous to do so!) is not to 'guilt' us into turning up to church begrudgingly. Rather, I'm hoping that

we will think again about the great blessing it is to belong.

We belong to the body of Jesus Christ. We share in that privilege. He is our Head and we are together arms, legs, feet, hands, eyes and ears. We belong to the family of Jesus. He is our elder brother and we are joined to him in bonds of family, as brothers and sisters. We belong to the temple of God. The Holy Spirit lives in us; in our communal life together, in our caring for one another, in our praise and prayer, in our joy and tears, and as we sit under the word of God. We belong. How good is that?
