# Quick Resources on the Question of Suffering

15 March 2023

In last week's talk Scott raised the issue of suffering, and it may have left some wanting to think through this issue more. Jews and Christians have wrestled for thousands of years over the question of why God allows evil and suffering. So, if you are wrestling with that question, you are not alone. It also means there are many resources to look to for assistance. Here are just a few of those resources:

- 1. You could read:
  - (a) In the Old Testament Job, Psalm 22 (and other Psalms) and Lamentations
  - (b) In the New Testament the passion of Jesus, such as in John 19.

Our God suffers with us. Many Christian 'greats' cried out to God in pain and suffering.

- 2. There are many podcasts and interviews with people in the midst of difficult times eg:
  - a. Undeceptions Episode 67 from May 2022, titled "On Suffering", which contains an interview with Mary Ellen and Jackson Rogers.
  - Undeceptions has a couple of short episodes where John Dickson interviews his friend Ben Shaw and then reflects on Ben's death: see "Still Cancer" on 29 March 2021 and then "Facing Death" on 28 June 2021.
  - c. Or consider Undeceptions Episode 76 from August 2022, titled "Against Euthanasia" for a different take on the subject.
  - d. Hope 103.2 produces several podcasts involving personal interviews. For example: the Undistracted and Finding Hope podcasts. Try the Finding Hope interview with Melissa Lipsett on 25 October 2021 (about her broken home and background).
- There are many books by ordinary people on the topic. Consider the short book *Carried: A Mother's Memories of a Life Cut Short,* by Gail Parker, from Taree. Gail is Christian and wrote the book about the death of her daughter, Corrine. There are many other books like that one.
- 4. C S Lewis wrote *A Grief Observed*, about the death of his wife. He also wrote *The Problem of Pain*, which deals with the question in a more academic and less emotive way. Or try a biography of Dietrich Bonhoeffer, a Christian man executed by the Nazis.
- 5. Tim Keller wrote a book called *Walking with God through Pain and Suffering* (worth reading) and was *subsequently* diagnosed with pancreatic cancer and told "you will die from it". Listen to:
  - a. Tim's interview on 7 January 2023 with Justin Brierley of the UK podcast 'Unbelievable?' about how cancer has impacted, and indeed benefitted, him.
  - b. John Dickson's interview with Tim on the Undeceptions podcast (title "With Keller") on 4 April 2022.

- 6. The problem of evil and suffering is often said to have two distinct aspects: an intellectual problem (that philosophers love to debate) and the emotional problem (that New Atheists use to claim that God does not exist). For a detailed treatment of both by an academic Christian philosopher consider William Lane Craig's website 'Reasonable Faith' <u>www.reasonablefaith.org</u>. You will find there:
  - a. Dr Craig's "In the Arena" podcasts, with recordings of his debates on the topic with Phillip Adams, A C Grayling, Sam Harris, Christopher Hitchens and more.
  - b. A lot of written material, with detail and arguments, for example:

- 7. For some people, a problem to do with suffering arises by reason of the Old Testament and the pain and suffering that occurs in the OT. For:
  - a popular-level discussion of it, listen to the podcast "Ask NT Wright Anything", episode #155 on 3 February 2023 called "Making Sense of Old Testament Violence".
  - b. a more detailed treatment, consider reading Is God a Moral Monster by Paul Copan.
- 8. And, ultimately, the extent of suffering is a concern because we bring a Christian perspective to it. Without God, and his external standard, we have no solid basis for being concerned about evil and suffering. The fact that we are so concerned by evil and suffering is essentially evidence that God exists and we are made in his image.
