
### SAVE THE DATE - MISSION & AID SUNDAY

## SATURDAY AFTERNOON BUSH WALK

The Manly Dam circuit is one of the North Shores' hidden attractions. The walk is along bush tracks and fire trails, and has been described as secluded, with scenic lakeside vistas, colourful wildflowers in season, woodland, waterfalls, cascades, wetlands and rambling heath.



Where: Meet at the Main Entrance of the Park (near the dam wall), 112 King St Manly Vale

There is free parking near the end of King St, 100m before you enter the Manly Dam State Park. With a Northern Beaches Parking

Permit you will be able to park for free at the first parking area past the entrance gate.

It is about a 7.5km walk, taking up to 3 hours. Moderate fitness is required. Please wear appropriate sturdy footwear and bring water, hat and sunscreen.

## St Andrew's Financial Update

An interview with David Vidilini (Honorary Treasurer) and Tori Grimes (Member 6:45pm)

#### Q1: What is the current financial situation of our church?

Dave: At the AGM I gave an update that we were **10-11%** on our giving at the end of Feb. The March offertory numbers are in, and we are still tracking at 10-11% down for the year against what we budgeted for giving. This equates to **\$22,000 behind our budgeted giving target.** If this trend continues, we are looking at a **\$100,000** behind for the year. We have the kickstart as well, which is still short by **\$40,000.** However, if there was a priority between the two, then the offertory is a critical element because 90% of that goes to the operations of the church (the other 10% to Mission & Aid). While there are some cash reserves to help cover this, if we continue on our current giving trajectory, then we will need to ask some pretty serious questions.

Mal: For those who don't know, it is the Parish Council with the senior minister and the Wardens that approve the budget for the church. The Parish Council are representatives elected by the church at the AGM and they approve a budget based on their belief that the church can achieve what is set. So, in a similar way to when Paul urges the Corinthians to 'bring to completion' what they said they would give, in supporting the Macedonians. So, in the same way I urge you to 'bring to completion' the budget that the Parish Council has set. Paul says in 2 Corinthians 8:7 "You excel in everything, now excel in the gift of giving." So, please prayerfully consider how you can support the budget and see that 11% get reduced, God willing to 0%!

#### Q2: Why do you give to church and what would you say in order to encourage people to give?

Tori: Three reasons and a bonus reason why I give to church. Firstly, I give because I love God. All that I have is given to me from God, so I give back to God to him what is already his. Secondly, I give because I love others, both Christians and non-Christians. We can participate in the local church as we give. We can't all be ministers, so we get secular jobs and with the money we earn, we support the local church. It is how we as a family participate in the building up of the body and the growth of the kingdom really directly. Thirdly, I give because it is good for me. In Luke, Jesus says watch out for greed. A man's life does not consist in the abundance of his possessions. We are so prone to materialism and selfishness and generosity and giving is the antidote to giving. He knows it is good for us and we can get joy from it. If we don't start this, then it only gets harder when it is older. If you wait, then you will never get there. The bonus reason is that as we give to church, we support more than just St Andrew's but the work of other individuals and organisations through our mission giving. Our collective power of giving makes this a powerful way to support these partners.

Mal: Can I encourage those who are attending St Andrew's and who are not currently giving to the work of the church, for whatever reason – whether you are new, or circumstances have prevented this, but if that has changed, to consider starting to give to the work of the church. There is information how to give on the Newsletter or the Website. Can I also encourage those who are currently giving to church, to prayerfully consider, how you can help reduce the deficit, so that we can bring to completion what we as a church have committed to? This will give the Wardens and I confidence to make decisions on behalf of the church. We have money for a Part-time youth worker, but we may need to look for a full time one. We would like to bring Ness Hughes on full-time next, but if we don't reach out current budget, then we can't consider these things for next year. So, please prayerfully consider how you can support the ministry at St Andrew's.
