

CHURCH BUSH WALK

Are you interested in a Church bush walk on a Saturday afternoon?

The Manly Dam circuit is one of the North Shores' hidden attractions. The walk is along bush tracks and fire trails, and has been described as secluded, with scenic lakeside vistas, colourful wildflowers in season, woodland, waterfalls, cascades, wetlands and rambling heath.

When: Saturday July 13, 1:00pm

Where: Meet at the Main Entrance of the Park (near the dam wall), 112 King St Manly Vale

There is free parking near the end of King St, 100m before you enter the Manly Dam State Park. With a Northern Beaches Parking Permit you will be able to park for free at the first parking area past the entrance gate.

It is about a 7.5km walk, taking up to 3 hours. Moderate fitness is required. Please wear appropriate sturdy footwear and bring water, hat and sunscreen.

To continue fellowship with your fellow walkers, please bring a snack during a short break during the walk.

SAFE MINISTRY MOMENT

With Monday being the first staff meeting of July, our staff discussed Child Safe Standard 4: Equity is upheld and diverse needs are taken into account.

This standard reminds us that while all children (under 18s) are vulnerable, some children are more vulnerable to abuse than others and find it harder to speak up or be understood when they are communicating that they have been abused.

In fact all people (children, youth and adults) will be inherently more vulnerable if they:

Are living with disability

Come from specific religious or cultural backgrounds (E.g. Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children as well as children from refugee communities may also have particular concerns about authorities interacting with family) Are very young

Have previously been exposed to trauma

Feel vulnerable because of their gender identity or sexuality Live remotely

It is important to recognise as a church that all of these factors can mean children are less likely to report abuse.

As a team, we discussed the importance to have a diverse range of approaches to identifying, minimising and reporting abuse. We can't simply rely on people "speaking up", when the most vulnerable to abuse, may not be able to easily do so. We also reflected on the importance to reflect on our own biases, identifying cultural blind spots, and ensuring our leadership, upfront volunteers and teams reflect the God-gifted diversity of the community around us.

As a church, we embrace standard 4 when we see listen well across cultures, integrate faith and culture through a gospel lens and when we hear, see and learn from diverse voices, knowing that all tribes, tongues and nations will be around God's throne.
