Revive Youth Mission Nights are coming up on 6th, 13th and 20th September. Please pray for our youth, that they would be bold inviting their friends along, and that many more youth would come to a saving knowledge of our Lord as a result.

## SAFE MINISTRY MOMENT

This month for our Safe Ministry Moment, the team spent time reflecting on the first 5 Child Safe Standards we have thought about throughout this year.

We paused to consider what we have already implemented in the safe ministry space:

- Info slides in services/ posters in ministry spaces
- Newsletter reflections on each discussion
- Communicating toileting procedures
- Introducing Safe Ministry into key membership moments (belonging, serving, staff onboarding)

And we also considered ideas and reflections that are yet to be implemented:

- Kids and Youth Feedback form in T4 to ensure kids voices are heard
- Summary documents to be made of current statistics / key child protection information pertaining to churches
- Possible introduction of a Safe Ministry Sunday where we focus on Biblical teaching about safety each year
- Ensuring all Parish Councillors and Wardens have completed the safe ministry course (and encouraging other key leaders to complete it as well, e.g. small group leaders)
- Continued culture of transparency and clarity

It was great to look back and reflect and ensure we don't lose sight of ideas/ gaps in our practice that we highlighted across the year. Next month we will drill down into Child Safety Standard 6 where we will discuss the processes that respond to complaints of child abuse and whether they are child focussed.

## **BUSH WALK**

Are you interested in joining the St Andrew's walking group for an early morning walk from the Spit Bridge to Manly, on **Saturday September 21?** 

Meet at 8am at Grumpy's Wharf Cafe on the South (Mosman) side of the Spit Bridge on Spit Rd.

There is free parking on Parriwi Road (East Side) or paid parking at Spit West Car Park. Car sharing is encouraged.

The iconic Spit to Manly coastal Scenic

Walkway is one of the most spectacular Sydney Harbour foreshore walks. This is a great opportunity to enjoy fellowship and the beauty of God's creation as we walk along a lovely stretch of Sydney Harbour. There are of course magnificent harbour views, but also a number of other surprises. There are sandy beaches, protected coves, sandstone cliffs, caves and waterfalls, as well aboriginal engravings. The walkway passes through patches of gully rainforest, open woodland, heath and coastal scrub. As you approach Manly, the pathway winds through lovely suburban streets.

This is about a 9km walk and will take up to 4 hours. Moderate fitness is required, as there are lots of stairs. Coffee and lunch are options at the end of the walk in Manly, before a 20 minute bus ride on the 144 back to the Spit Bridge. Nick Barbarino will lead the walk.

Please wear appropriate footwear and bring water, a snack, hat and sunscreen.
