"If You Can — Do" (Something)

(Continuing the Excellent Conversation Began by Philip Heath)

"If you can - do." It sounds right. It sounds Christian - because it is!

You've got gifts? Use them. Open doors? Step through them. Needs? Meet them. After all, we serve a generous God who tells parables about talents not buried, lamps not hidden, and fruit bearing trees. We are to be faithful stewards — not passive, not idle.

In Luke's Gospel, we see Jesus healing, preaching, casting out demons. He calls disciples, sends them out, empowers them. He affirms the persistent widow who keeps knocking.

But then, Luke 4. Jesus has just begun his ministry in Galilee. He heals, teaches, and crowds beg him to stay. There's more he could do. But what does he say?

"I must proclaim the good news of the kingdom of God to the other towns also, because that is why I was sent." (Luke 4:43)

He could stay. He could heal more people. But he walks away. Not because he doesn't care — but because he's focused on all the Father has sent him to do.

That's confronting. Because we live in a world of endless need. The inbox never stops. The church always needs more hands. And "if you can - do" feels like the only faithful response.

But Jesus shows us the freedom of a holy "no." Not a selfish one. Not an apathetic or an overwhelmed one. A "no" that's shaped by a deeper "yes."

Yes to the kingdom. Yes to the Father's call. Yes to, at times, withdrawing to spend time with God. And Yes to the next town.

Following Jesus means asking not only "What can I do?", but also "What have I been sent to do?"

So yes - use your gifts. Be generous. Take initiative.

If you can – Do ... something. But not everything. Don't be afraid to say no. It's wrong to do nothing, but unwise to attempt everything. Even Jesus didn't do everything, and his capacity is greater than yours and mine.

- For peace in the country and for people affected by the conflict- for Humanitarian Assistance and the scarcity of health supplies.

Revive Youth Winter Camp

- For safety as they travel to and from the campsite

- For any non-christians coming, that they would encounter the risen Lord Jesus and accept Him as their Lord and saviour
- For Beth as she co-directs a youth camp for the first time
- For Indira as she preaches God's word to the youth
- For all the other leaders as they disciple their youth in discussion groups, seminars, and in the incidental moments

Those who are sick

- Pray for healing and comfort for members of our church family and community who are unwell.
- Ask God to give strength to those undergoing treatment and peace to those waiting on results.
- Pray for medical professionals, that they would have endurance, skill, and compassion.
- Remember those struggling with mental health challenges, pray for support, hope, and healing.

The World

- Pray for a lasting resolution to the war in Ukraine & Russia, for protection of civilians, and for the global community to support justice and peace.
- Ask God to bring an end to the ongoing violence in Gaza and Israel, to comfort grieving families, and to guide leaders toward reconciliation and peace.
- Pray for stability and humanitarian aid to reach those displaced by ongoing civil conflict in Sudan.
- With millions displaced due to war and climate disasters, pray for nations to respond with compassion and for displaced people to find safety and hope.

- Give thanks for the break and rest from routine for students, teachers, and families.
- Pray for safe travel and meaningful time together for families during the holidays.
- Ask God to refresh teachers and school staff in preparation for the new term.
- Pray for children who may feel lonely or unsafe during the break, that they would know God's presence and care.
